1. INTRODUCTION

The 2025 floods were among the most destructive in Pakistan's recent history. Beginning with **torrential cloudbursts and flash floods** in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, followed by record-breaking monsoon rains and water inflows from India, the devastation swept across multiple provinces, destroying lives, homes, and livelihoods.

In immediate response, MTJF launched the "Nusrat-e-Insaniat" Emergency Response, grounded in the Islamic principle of Khidmat-e-Khalq fi Sabeelillah (serving humanity solely for the pleasure of Allah).



2. MTJF OPERATIONS TIMELINE AND COVERAGE

Early Response – Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (August 2025)

MTJF was among the first responders in KPK, deploying teams within hours of the cloudburst emergency. Immediate interventions in Buner, Swat, Shangla, and Dir provided shelter, medical care, and cooked meals to displaced families before other agencies arrived.

Expanded Response – Punjab (Late August to September 2025)

As monsoon rains intensified, MTJF scaled operations to southern Punjab — focusing on Khanewal, Multan, Muzaffargarh, Bahawalpur, Okara, Sahiwal, Toba Tek Singh, and Vehari — with extensive food, water, and medical distributions.

Transition – Rehabilitation Phase (October 2025 Onward)

With receding floodwaters, MTJF initiated Phase-II Rehabilitation, including house reconstruction, livelihood revival, agriculture support, cash aid, and winterization assistance.

Medical Assistance: Preventing a Secondary Crisis

- **15** Mobile Medical Camps established across Buner, Swat, Shangla, and Dir.
- **5,250+** patients treated for infections, injuries, and waterborne diseases.
- **2.5** tonnes of medicines distributed.

The first days were critical. We saw children suffering from contaminated water; our camps were the only medical relief for miles.

Food & Nutrition Security

- **25,000+** cooked meals distributed in the first week.
- **2,800** family ration bags provided, each serving 7–8 family members for one month.
- Prioritized widows, elderly, and differently-abled families.





Assessments for Rehabilitation

- **500+** homes surveyed for reconstruction.
- **350+** families identified for livelihood grants.
- **25 schools, 15 masjids, 8 madaris** documented for rehabilitation planning.



5. PUNJAB OPERATIONS – EXTENSIVE RELIEF & ONGOING SUPPORT

Parallel to the KPK response, MTJF teams provided large-scale relief in southern Punjab, reaching over **37,000** individuals.

MTJF has now transitioned toward rebuilding lives and restoring dignity. Activities include:

a Construction of Disaster-Resilient Houses

For families who lost their homes completely.

c Livelihood & Agri Support

Seed and fertilizer distribution, livestock support, and business reactivation grants.

b Cash Assistance

Direct financial aid for families to restart small-scale livelihoods.

d Seasonal Clothing, Bedding & Kitchen Kits

As winter begins, MTJF is distributing warm clothing, blankets, bedding, and cooking utensils.

Education & Religious Infrastructure

Rehabilitation of damaged schools, masjids, and madaris to restore community life.
